

10 things to know about ARED

- ARED is a non-governmental non-profit dedicated to training, publishing and educational innovations
- ARED is based in Dakar and works in many countries in West Africa, particularly in the Sahel
- Founded in 1990, ARED works to promote quality education in African languages for grassroots communities, through training, publishing, educational innovation and action research.
- ARED works in two educational sectors: formal (elementary education) and nonformal.

In formal education, ARED provides technical support to the Government of Senegal in its search for quality in education. Since 2009, with support from the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, and 2014 with Dubai Cares, ARED is working to provide a solution to the issue of improving the performance of students in reading/writing, math and natural science, through a pilot project covering 208 classes and reaching more than 10,500 pupils in the first four years of elementary school. The objective is to highlight a teaching-learning model based on native languages and to demonstrate that children learn better in their language.

In non-formal education, ARED seeks to improve communities' opportunities through capacity building in areas that directly affect their daily lives and could lead to change at the community level.

Over the past 10 years, ARED has invested extensively in the design, testing and dissemination of original teaching and training tools on issues related to pastoralism and livestock in West Africa. ARED was at the heart of the design and dissemination process of the module on cattle trade with "Groupe Développement" under the project to support the productivity of agro-pastoral systems (PAPE) in Mali, Burkina,



Togo, Benin, Niger, Mauritania and Chad.

Our values, our assumptions, our concrete results ARED boasts an extensive experience of successes and innovations in publishing and training. Since its inception, ARED has successfully published approximately 314 documents in seven series:

- Basic literacy and numeracy skills
- Planning and Leadership
- Civil society
- Literature, culture and local knowledge
- Health
- Scientific and technical Information
- Religion.

These publications are written primarily in six national languages: Pulaar, Wolof, Mandinka, Serer, Diola and Soninké.

In order to better share with African partners, 29 of these publications are translated into French.

Currently, ARED has printed and sold over 1,460,000 books, 510 training activities completed, 15,000 people trained (community leaders, trainers, teachers, etc.) in Senegal, Africa and the rest of the world.

ARED built early on an experienced and highly skilled team which is supported by a wide network of human resources - experts in various fields, teachers, linguists, community trainers, etc. to achieve its objectives.



Also, primary school aged children, unschooled or under-schooled adolescents will find in the innovations initiated by ARED methods and appropriate tools for improved education in their native languages.
